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# Aboriginal Cultural Tour

Troy Bennell from Ngalang Wongi Aboriginal Cultural Tours shared some Noongar history and culture during a walking and bus tour for Chamber members held on October 16.

ANZAC Park in Stirling Street used to be a Noongar camping ground and Noongar women used to meet in the area of the Stirling Street Arts Centre, where babies were born, while men had a place near the foot of Marlston Hill, Troy said.

Noongar artworks, including several by Troy, feature in the colourful street art of the CBD.

Troy's painting, left, includes many Noongar words including Kaya - hello/welcome/yes, Goomburrup - Bunbury, yongka - kangaroo, Koombannup - Koombana, djilki - freshwater crustaceans and djidi-djidi - willie wagtail.
